The Technology Committee meets to discuss the use of technology within the Rye City School District. The Committee typically meets monthly from 4:00-5:30 p.m. Meetings this year will be virtual via Google Meet. The first meeting is in November. A complete meeting schedule will be provided to all committee members.

The Technology Committee Charge for 2020-2021 is as follows:

- Initiate a cohesive vision for the use of technology within the Rye City School District
- Propose and evaluate potential hardware and software products for use in the District and make recommendations to the Superintendent
- Research, discuss, and recommend professional development opportunities for teachers and administration members
- Develop and analyze an internal survey regarding the state of technology availability and usage within the Rye City School District, if appropriate
- Review the Technology Plan, if needed
- Review data privacy regulations Education Law 2D, as needed
